L: A reading from Acts:

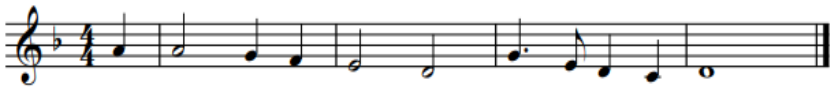

L: A reading from 1 John:

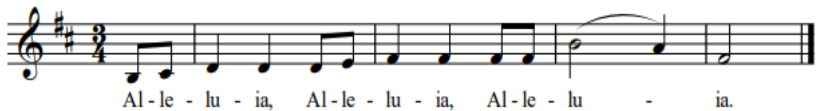

How does God’s love abide in anyone who has the world’s goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help? Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action. And by this we will know that we are from the truth and will reassure our hearts before him whenever our hearts condemn us; for God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God; and we receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him. And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. All who obey his commandments abide in him, and he abides in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us.

- + For thankful and joyful hearts as we celebrate with gladness the gift of new life, especially for the safe arrival of Layla Lane, that she be blessed with good health, and that her family members and those charged with her physical, emotional, and spiritual well-being would remember that God blesses and cares for them as well.
- + For the saints of the Church, especially, we remember, St. Mark the Evangelist: May his faithful witness of our Lord and commitment to sharing the Gospel inspire us as we endeavor to be co-workers for the kingdom of God.
- + Into your hands we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in your mercy, through your Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord.

Upcoming Scripture Reading: Genesis 28

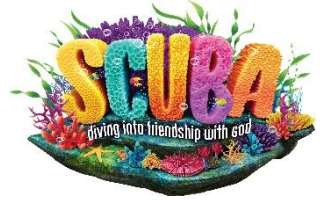

Spring Window Replacement Appeal

Gifts to Date: \$7,105.00

Goal of \$10,000

This Summer, Trinity will be replacing 25 windows along the Lafayette Ave side of the church at a cost of \$33020.00. The new windows will be fixed picture windows over top of horizontal sliding windows on bottom. The old windows were compromised at joints and seals, inefficient, and difficult to manage when needing to be adjusted. The new windows will give greater efficiency, manageability, and uniformity of all the windows on that side of the church. Since this project is a bit beyond normal maintenance of the church, we are asking parishioners and friends to consider making a special gift to support the project. Our hope is to raise \$10,000 in special gifts to help offset the cost of the window replacement. 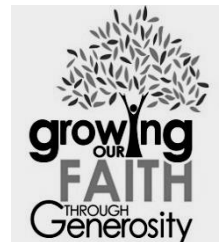
